Texas Society Awards Program

At the Texas Society Executive Council meeting held this past October, a proposal to implement a Texas Star Awards Program was adopted. Preliminary qualifications for the Gold Award would be in recognition of special achievements by Society members at the State level (such as officer /chairman services) or National level, the Silver Award would recognize special achievements at the Society or Chapter level beyond which is normally expected of a member; the Bronze Award recognizes special achievements at the Society level as determined by the Society Commander and/or the SEC or Awards Chairman. The above picture is an example of the medals. It was approved that a décor or attachment be added to the ribbon to distinguish this medal as a Texas Society award.
