Commander's Comments

Our Commander, David McMahon and our Adjutant, James Putman, are on their way to the GEC meeting in Natchez, Mississippi, with their wives. On their way there they drove by Blair's Landing, the battlefield where General Tom Green was killed.

The **Battle of Blair's Landing** (April 12, 1864) saw a Confederate cavalry-artillery force commanded by Brigadier General Tom Green attack several Union gunboats led by Rear Admiral David Dixon Porter and soldiers in river transports under

Brigadier General Thomas Kilby Smith in Red River Parish. Louisiana. Green's force attempted but failed to stop the retreat of Porter's and Smith's forces downstream in an action that was part of the Red River Campaign of the American Civil War. The only significant casualty during the fighting was Green, who was killed by an artillery round.

Ft. Chadbourne Monument Rededication

The weather for the Confederate Monument rededication was pleasant and the attendance very good at Fort Chadbourne. There was a contingent from Gainsville, Texas on hand representing the United Daughters of Confederacy, Order of the Confederate Rose and the SCV Camp located there. There was also a Father and Son from Pflugerville, Texas present dressed in full uniform.

The OCR and UDC organization of Gainesville have been raising mon-

ey for the restoration of the Monument as it had fallen into disrepair. Events transpired causing the removal of the Monument before repairs could be made. These organizations presented the Fort Chadbourne Foundation with the money raised.

The ceremony opened with Anne Pate and Garland Richards of the Fort Chadbourne Foundation followed by representatives from the MOSB Texas Society, David McMahon, UDC, Linda Turner, Angie Hare and Pam Cooper of Texas OCR, SCV Texas Division Commander John McCammon and the fine Boys in Grey of Goode's Light Artillery Battery and Texas 7th Infantry.

Goode's Light Artillery Battery, commanded by Major Ray Johnson (MOSB & SCV), and Texas 7th Infantry, commanded by Captain Harold Johnston (SCV), fired three volleys in memory of all who served in the Confederacy.

The month of April is recognized as Confederate History Month and it is a special time for us to promote our Southern Heritage and expound the history of Our Confederate Ancestors. There will be Confederate Memorial/ Texas Hero's Day service at the Fairmount Cemetery in San Angelo, on April 29th, at 10:00 AM. All are invited to attend this ceremony. As most have heard there is a "other side" commission that has the goal to eradicate all things Confederate from America's military and they are set to begin changing the names of military installations March 31. Ft. Pickett, Virginia, named for Major General George Pickett, will be the first victim to have its name changed. Several military units will lose 'streamers' from their unit's guidon, among them are two Texas National Guard units, 141st Infantry Regiment (San Antonio, TX) will lose 26, and 143d Infantry Regiment (Fort Worth, TX) will lose 5. It appears to be a coincidence that such despicable actions are starting just as we begin Confederate History Month.

Texas SEC Meeting

At the March SEC meeting in College Station, we had a report from Commander Joe Reynolds about the new Chapter in Temple. He also said that he was in communications with an At-Large member and they were discussing the possibilities of creating a Chapter in the Ft. Worth area. There was a reminder to all of the Texas Society Convention coming in June at which point, Commanding General Johnnie Holley reported on the major cost increase of the Convention, Food. Just like our weekly trip to the grocery store, we know all about the increases of the food we eat.

Lt. Commander Williamson reported that the Texas Society has 195 members. There was a brief report on the closing of Chapter 264 by David McMahon and that several of those members have transferred to Chapter 310. Our Chapter Commander, David McMahon, has been compiling a MOS&B roster book. National membership over the last two years has increased from 1400 to 1600 members. As previously reported about the Texas Star Awards, the award medal design has been set and they have been ordered. It was determined that the Society would not receive them in time for our State Convention; therefore they will be available for next year. The MOS&B store has been re-opened after moving to another web hosting company.

It has been noted that Our membership has risen from 1400 to 1600 members in two years.


